# **PURPOSE**

To outline to our school community the Department's and Westgrove Primary School's policy requirements relating to homework.

## **SCOPE**

This policy applies to students in all year levels and staff responsible for setting and monitoring homework at Westgrove Primary School.

### **RATIONALE**

Westgrove Primary School has developed this Homework Policy in consultation with the School Council to support student learning and wellbeing by:

- providing opportunities for students to review, revise and reinforce newly acquired skills
- fostering good lifelong learning and routines
- supporting learning partnerships with parents/carers.

# **DEFINITIONS**

Homework is tasks assigned to students by teachers that are meant to be carried out during non-school hours.

## **POLICY**

At Westgrove Primary School all homework set by teachers will be:

- purposeful
- curriculum-aligned
- appropriate to students' skill level and age
- designed to help students develop as independent learners
- monitored by the teacher
- where appropriate, provide opportunities for parents/carers to partner in their child's learning.

The types of homework that teachers at Westgrove Primary School will include are:

Homework may consist of daily:

#### Foundation:

- Reading with parents for 10 minutes (Take Home texts & Independent choice)
- Optional activities may include: Online Learning RAZ-Kids or Essential Assessment

#### Year 1-2

- Reading with parents for 15 minutes (Take Home texts & Independent choice)
- Optional activities may include: Online Learning RAZ-Kids or Essential Assessment

#### Year 3-4

- Reading with parents for 20 minutes (Take Home texts & Independent choice)
- Optional activities may include: Online Learning Epic or Essential Assessment

#### Year 5-6

- Independent reading on a daily basis 30 minutes (Take Home texts & Independent choice)
- Optional activities may include: Online Learning Epic or Essential Assessment

It is acceptable for teachers to assign unfinished classroom activities, research projects and individualised tasks as additional homework tasks.

- Research tasks should take into account the availability of resources.
- Homework may include unfinished class work.
- Individualised tasks will be decided at the departmental level.
- Positive recognition and rewards for the completion of homework tasks will be decided at the departmental level.

#### SHARED EXPECTATIONS AND RESPONSIBILITIES

Homework is a shared responsibility between the school, teachers, students and their parents/carers. In order to get the most out of homework tasks, it is important that everyone understands their obligations and responsibilities.

#### Responsibilities and expectations for leaders at Westgrove Primary School are to:

• advise teachers, students and parents/carers of homework expectations at the beginning of the school year and provide them with access to the homework policy.

# Responsibilities and expectations for teachers at Westgrove Primary School are to:

- ensure homework tasks are purposeful and appropriate to the student's skill level and age
- monitor reading routines and provide timely and practical feedback
- ensure the amount of homework set supports a student to engage with a range of recreational, family and cultural activities outside of school hours
- offer opportunities for families/carers to engage in their children's learning.

## Responsibilities and expectations for **students** are:

- being aware of the school's homework policy
- discussing homework expectations with their parents/carers
- accepting responsibility for the completion of homework tasks within set time frames
- following up on comments made by teachers
- seeking assistance when difficulties arise
- organising their time to manage home obligations, participation in physical activity and sports, recreational and cultural activities and part-time employment (for older students).

## Responsibilities and expectations for parents/carers are:

- ensuring there is a balance between the time spent on homework and recreational, family and cultural
  activities
- talking to teachers about any concerns they have about the homework
- discussing homework with their child in their first language, if English is not the main language spoken at home,
- in dialogue, linking homework to:

- o previous experiences the child and/or parent/carer may have had
- family culture(s), history(ies) and language(s)
- o relevant services, clubs, associations and community.
- ensuring there is a quiet study area for their child to complete homework.

# SUPPORT FOR STUDENTS AND PARENTS/CARERS

Westgrove Primary School understands that students have different learning strengths, preferences and interests and may approach learning activities and homework differently. If parents/carers are concerned their child may not understand the homework tasks that have been set or is spending a long period of time completing their homework, we encourage parents/carers to speak to their child's teacher.
