POKEMON CARDS

Over the last couple of weeks we have had an increase in issues involving Pokémon cards (particularly students trading cards).

Therefore, we will be enforcing a ban on Pokémon cards being brought to school. If a student brings their cards to school, they will be confiscated by the teacher and returned them at the end of the day.



NAPLAN 2023

Students in Years 3 and 5 will be participating in NAPLAN Online in 2023. This is the second year that the school will be conducting NAPLAN using the online platform, but it will be the first time that these specific students will complete the tests online.

The NAPLAN testing period is scheduled to take place earlier in the year to give teachers and parents important information about a student's skills and capability sooner, so that more targeted support can be delivered to improve literacy and numeracy skills throughout the year. It will be held during Term 1 from **Wednesday 15 March to Monday 27 March, (instead of in May)** and will encompass the same areas of Reading, Writing, Conventions of Language and Numeracy.

A timetable will be communicated to families in the coming weeks, detailing when students will be participating in the tests. We ask parents of students in Years 3 and 5 to record these dates in home diaries/calendars.



To prepare our students prior to the official testing period, students in Years 3 and 5 have been participating in a practice online NAPLAN assessment. A brochure detailing important NAPLAN information for parents has been posted for parents/guardians on Compass. Please take the time to read the information provided in the brochure, and please contact your child's teacher if you have any questions.

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District Swimming:



Growth Mindset in Maths

In general, a growth mindset is the belief that intelligence and 'smartness' can also be learned and that the brain grows from experience and effort. The opposite, a fixed mindset, is the idea that you are smart, or you are not. In maths, that translates into "some people are good at maths, and some are not." Did you know that praising efforts rather than intelligence or results can impact your child's ability to persevere in challenges?! The goal is to have children thrive on challenges and see failures, not as a sign of low intelligence, but as a learning opportunity. Brain research tells us that making mistakes actually wires more connections into the brain! When a person has a growth mindset, they accept challenges, see their efforts as worthwhile, and are open to learning from mistakes. Students with a growth mindset achieve at higher levels than those with fixed mindsets. How can you help? Some simple ways:

Adding "yet" when they claim they are "not good at this"
(Respond: "You are not good at

Ask questions that focus on their effort and choices and get them to reflect on satisfaction of that effort (e.g. What did you learn today? What mistake did you make that taught you something? What did you try hard at today?)

• Model this yourself as you share about your day

CSEF – Camps Sports and Excursion Fund

We are currently accepting applications for CSEF

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors. Excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works while sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are a part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from the website below.

If you applied for CSEF at your child's school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- **new student enrolments**; your child has started or changed schools this year.
- **changed family circumstances**; such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing this year. Check with the school office if you are unsure.
