TEACHING AND LEARNING UPDATE

Mathematics at Westgrove

Maths in Sports

There are lots of ways you can help and encourage your children to get involved with Maths at home using sports. At school, real-life Maths is often encountered in Physical Education classes and in general classroom sports talk. For example, distances run, time taken, etc.

If your child is interested in sports, you also have a wonderful opportunity to engage your child in Maths conversations. It may be as simple as keeping a family AFL tipping chart and adding up winning tips over the season; working out AFL goals and points scores with a chat about multiples of 6/the six-multiplication facts; or comparing and ordering the percentages on the AFL ladder.

For any other sports, you can look at the final scores for a pair of competing teams and work out the difference. The possibilities for Maths within sports are endless and can be very enjoyable for you and your children.

Literacy at Westgrove

Reading the world together

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It is important to show your child the value of reading for everyday purposes. The world is full of letters and words you and your child can read together. Below are some activities to promote reading:

- Include your child when you read recipes, greeting cards, calendars, shopping lists, food labels, instructions, maps, newspapers, emails, signs, weather forecasts and websites. For example, you could read a recipe together and follow the steps to make your child's favourite meal. Or you could ask your child to read and tick off each grocery item on a shopping list as you buy or unpack them.
- Cook alphabet soup and say letters together as you eat them.
- Play a word hunt. Write random words on bits of paper and place them around a room. Say one of the words and ask your child to find the right word.
- Put post-it notes on objects around the house so your child can read and learn new words every day.

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This year Westgrove will be participating in National Simultaneous Storytime (NSS) on Wednesday 25th May at 11.00am. NSS is held annually by the Australian Library and Information Association (ALIA). Every year a picture book, written and illustrated by an Australian author and illustrator, is read simultaneously in libraries, schools, pre-schools, childcare

centres, family homes, bookshops and many other places around the country. Now in its 22nd successful year, it is a colourful, vibrant, fun event that aims to promote the value of reading and literacy, using an Australian children's book that explores age-appropriate themes, and addresses key learning areas of the National Curriculum for Foundation to Year 6.

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Student Absences

A reminder for parents that if your child is sick or absent, you are required to notify their school as soon as possible **on the day of absence** using one of the following methods:

- 1. **Online:** log the absence directly using Compass (see 'How to' guides)
- 2. **Email:** the school and provide the staff with your child's name, class, date of absences and reason. Notifying the school of your child's absence either prior to, or on the day that they will be away, helps ensure the safety and wellbeing of children and will fulfil your legal responsibility. **Westgrove.ps@education.vic.gov.au**
 - 3. **Telephone:** the school office and leave a message on the absence line.

Why do I need to notify the school if my child is absent?

Schools need to know when and why a child is absent and you need to know if your child isn't at school. **Going to school every day is the single most important part of your child's education, they learn new things every day – missing school puts them behind.**

What is your responsibility?

You are legally required to ensure your child attends school every day or you must provide an explanation for their

absence. You should let the school know in advance of any upcoming absences or let them know in the morning if your child won't be at school. In order for schools to implement the same day notification requirement, it's essential that you provide the school with your most up-to-date contact details. Generally, one notification will be sent per family. Should there be circumstances that require both parents and carers to be notified, please contact

the school to make the necessary


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
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HOW TO ADD AN ATTENDANCE APPROVAL NOTE USING COMPASS PARENT PORTAL



1. You will see a notification on your homepage if an Attendance Note is required due to unexplained absence. Clicking this link will take you to all Unexplained Absences, to which you can enter Attendance Notes to explain.



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
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- 2. You can also select **Add Attendance Note** which will take you directly to the Attendance Note Editor to create a note for that student
- 3. Select the reason for your child's absence



- 4. Enter any further details that the school should know regarding this absence.
- **5.** Enter the start/end date & time that your child will be/has been affected by the absence (for a full day of absence, ensure you select times that cover from 9:00am to 3:15pm)
- 6. Check that the times you have selected will affect the appropriate sessions that the child was absent/late for
- 7. You may choose to upload any supporting documents, such as doctor's notes.
- 8. Click "Save" to save the Attendance Note to Compass, your approval will automatically be added to your


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HOW TO ADD AN ATTENDANCE APPROVAL NOTE USING THE COMPASS APP.
