We would like to congratulate Emily Parsons and her partner Joel on the safe arrival of their son, Ollie who arrived in late March.




MOTHERS DAY STALL

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INDIVIDUAL EDUCATION PLANS (IEPs)



STUDENT ATTENDANCE – EVERY DAY COUNTS

In our ongoing efforts to improve student learning, we have been looking closely at student attendance. We aim to:

- better understand the reasons for student absences
- monitor our processes at school for recording student absences to ensure they are accurate and consistent
- develop consistent processes for responding to student absences
- work with families to improve attendance where necessary



Did you know???

- If students miss school regularly, they miss out on learning the fundamental skills that will set them up for success in the later years of school.
- There is no safe number of days for missing school each day a student misses puts them behind and can affect their educational outcomes.
- Each missed day is associated with progressively lower achievement in numeracy, writing and reading.

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HOW CAN PARENTS HELP WITH ATTENDANCE?

Attendance Matters



- Ensure your child(ren) attend school every day unless they are unwell
- Establish regular routines for bedtime and getting up for school
- If you're having attendance issues with your child, please let your classroom teacher know so we can work together to get your child to school every day
- Provide school a reason for your child's absence:
 - Note to the teacher 0
 - Phone call to the office 0
 - Talk directly to the teacher
 - Notify school through COMPASS
